Year 9's have been studying the film *'Jasper Jones'* and have had their heads down, finishing the analytical essay. 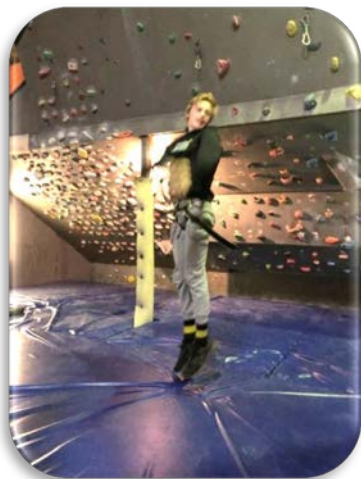
To finish, we walked on nails and held a snake! The kids were mostly awesome, with Brodie, Caitlyn and Holly P voted best effort on camp.”

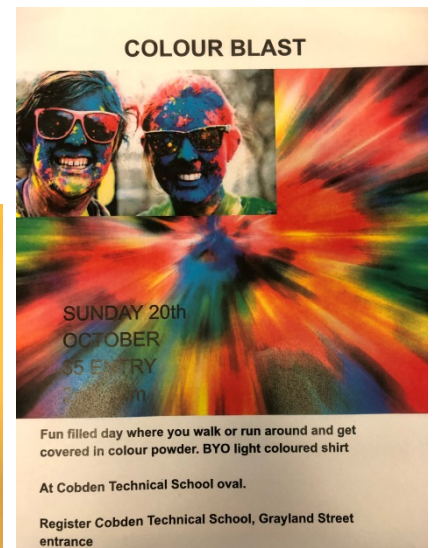
