From the Principal's Desk – Wednesday 6th March 2019

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- **changed family circumstances**; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

GP Superbikes excursion

5:00 AM 22/02/2019 - It's an early start for Malcolm Ward, actually well before 5am, to pick up 2 staff members then onto Terang for the bus. We picked up a few students eagerly waiting with a parent, to get started on one of the best school excursions this year.



We, seventeen students, a parent and three staff, were off to Phillip Island, to the GP Superbikes. It is a three day event, with Friday being the only day during the year where students are allowed free entry to the venue AND are allowed entry into the pits. After five hours on the bus, everyone was quite relieved to be standing up straight again and to start exploring the GP Superbikes venue.

We arranged to meet back at the foot of the circuit pedestrian bridge at 1pm to visit the pits, the riders and the crew. And, of course, the bikes!



Before all that, we took our time to visit the pavilion for the annual 'Expo' of the latest safety gear, machinery, VR technology and innovations in bikes. Amazingly highly-tuned motorcycles, able to send you straight to hospital within the first 30 seconds if you can't ride responsibly. We saw some hot off the press, dual front wheel bikes, some high tech, retro motorcycles and the ubiquitous show-bags and other goodies.

Once we were 'behind the scenes', in the pits, students spoke with riders, asked them about different aspects of the life of a competition rider. Some students even had the gumption to ask to sit on a race bike. Well done Justin and Ryan. Other students went for the souvenir route and asked to have a used tyre, which the crews were happy to give away.

(Note to students: get the souvenir at the *end* of the day, it gets heavy after a while...)



In the meantime, heats for various bike classes were on the way throughout the day. To describe the noise would be like imagining a swarm of bees on steroids, going past you at neck snapping speed, except it was louder and with a higher pitch. That's why all crew wore earmuffs.

We had a great view from the top of the bike pit crew building, watching them come in on full electronic throttle control in the pit lanes then take off to rapidly gain speeds of 250kph plus.

After everyone had eaten their fill from the many food stands around the 7km circuit, had eaten their lunch and snacks, and drank litres of water [it started to get warm in the afternoon] we met back at the foot of the pedestrian overpass and started on our way home. Things weren't quite so noisy on the way home. We pulled up at Geelong to eat our fill of a 'caterers pack' for 21 people. Even then, some of the students felt they needed to eat some more food. After our stomachs were full, the bus got quieter and quieter until, a bit after 11pm we pulled into the school's carpark again. What a day.

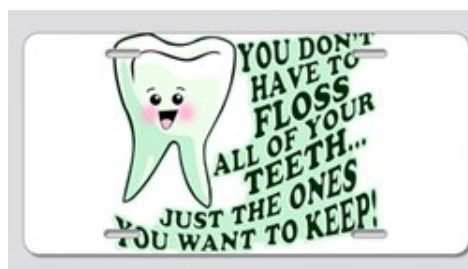



L2P MENTORING

Mentor Support

You will be given a free training course to help you in learning the skills, to guide you in your supporting role with your learner driver.

Our L2P Project Coordinator will match mentors to learners, to make sure they suit each other.

This will help make it a safe and rewarding time for the mentor and learner driver.

Our L2P Project Officer will keep in regular contact with you and the learner drivers to support you in your role.

Where does the Program Operate?

L2P program is based at Terang and Mortlake Health Services in Terang, but the car will be covering the whole Corangamite Shire.

L

Learner Drivers – do need help to get 120 hours of supervised driving experience?

Having a driver's licence is important for young people to get to:

- Further education and training such as TAFE and university
- Employment
- Sport, social life and family

Sometimes young people find it hard to access a supervising driver or a suitable car or both. If you need help we can assist you.

The L2P Program (learner to probationer) is funded by the TAC and managed by VicRoads and provides trained volunteer drivers to act as Supervising Drivers.

- We provide a car **and**
- We provide 7 free professional driving lessons **and**
- We provide volunteer Supervising Drivers to supervise your driving practice **and**
- It's free! You only need to pay for your learner permit, log book and drivers licence test (once you complete 120 hours of supervised driving).

What do you need?

- between 16 and 21 years of age and
- have a Victorian Learner Driver Permit and
- have a Victorian Learner Driver's log book and
- have trouble accessing a supervising driver or a suitable car or both for your driving practice sessions as a learner driver.

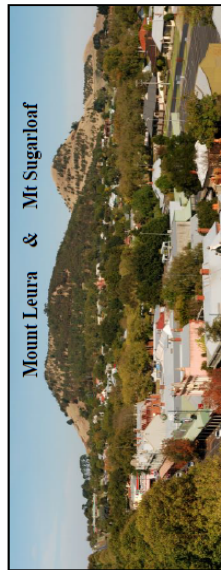

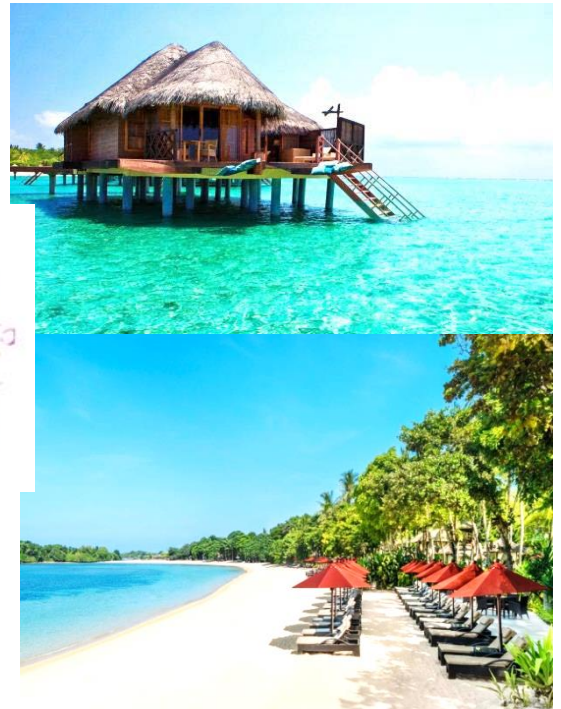
