Principal’s Desk

Rohan Keert – Principal

After more than a decade as Principal of Cobden Technical School, it’s time for me to move on. I have been appointed as Director to lead the new Warrnambool Tech School. I will be leaving Cobden Tech to take up the new role in the middle of Term 2 this year.

I have always said it is a privilege to lead a school that belongs to the local community. To be the responsible custodian until the next leader takes over. I will miss the everyday interactions with students, staff, volunteers, parents, and the Cobden community.

There have been several highlights over the past 10 years that make me proud to belong to the Cobden Tech community. These include the establishment of the Corangamite Trade Training Cluster, the 50th Anniversary celebrations, and the way our school adapted to the relocation to Camperdown College during the St Patrick’s Day fires.

However, it is the small, everyday interactions with students that I will miss the most. Like the Year 7 boys at the CTS Athletics carnival this week that said to me, “We love Cobden Tech. It’s way better than primary school. We get to do so many different things.”



The Department of Education will conduct an EOI process to appoint an Acting Principal for the remainder of 2024. The process to recruit the next ongoing Cobden Technical School Principal will occur in the second half of the year. It is anticipated that my replacement will commence at the beginning of the 2025 school year.

My new role is to establish and lead a new Tech School in Warrnambool. It will be a hi-tech STEM (science, technology, engineering & mathematics) centre of excellence.

Warrnambool Tech School will be housed within the South West TAFE campus site and engage secondary students from government and non-government schools across the three local government areas of Corangamite, Moyne, and Warrnambool in single or multi-day programs linked to the curriculum at their home school.

All programs and bus transport will be provided entirely free of charge for schools and students.

The new Centre will connect schools and industry in contemporary learning programs that challenge students to solve problems in a real-world context - bridging the gap between emerging industries and future innovators.

Warrnambool Tech School will be designed to elicit an immediate positive reaction from students and visitors (the wow factor), providing energised, green, and hi-tech architecture commensurate with the cutting-edge nature of the experience provided within.

Learning spaces will be designed to support the learning programs on offer, providing a variety of spaces for different activities, including the regular use of hi-tech equipment chosen to support the learning programs including 3D printing, robotics, coding, and other emerging trends.

It is anticipated that the Warrnambool Tech School will be opened and operating by Term 3, 2026.

Assistant Principal Report

One of the most enjoyable aspects of my job is being able to work with students and their families to celebrate their achievements. Two weeks ago, I was fortunate to accompany students to the **HSSSD Interschool Swimming**. I was very proud of our students who assisted with running events during the day, encouraged each other and put their hand up to swim in the relay and team events demonstrating great sportsmanship and community spirit. These are our Community values that demonstrate the Teamwork aspect of our HEART values.

In a similar fashion, it was wonderful to have Year 7 and 8 parents attend an afternoon tea this week to celebrate the start of the school year and meet some key staff. We all enjoyed some delicious food cooked by our students and then met Simon Dewar from **Real Schools** who discussed the importance of building positive relationships with young people and how the school and families can work together. We thank those that attended, and due to its success and positive feedback we are looking to run a similar session for Year 9/10 students and families in Term 2, so keep an eye out for this.



Our staff have been busy implementing our **School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Systems (SWPBS)** and you will see students are getting many Heart Values 'green' merit points on Compass rewarding their behaviours. The student leadership are discussing with students how we will be rewarding students with ideas such as Taco Tuesday being mentioned as well as items including drink bottles with logos. If you have any creative ideas we would love to hear about them.

It has been a super busy term and this week was no exception. Staff attended a **Numeracy Community of Practice day** in Dunkeld to support our work improving Numeracy. We also welcomed Cobden Primary School and Simpson Primary School students on site for our first **Come and Try Day** which will lead into our **Open Night** on Monday 18th March. Students enjoyed some cooking with Mrs McLennan and some fun activities with Mr Simmonds.

Next week we have a performance **'Backflips Against Bullying'** which our Year 7/8 students will attend, **NAPLAN** begins and **School Photos** will also take place. Please ensure that students are in full school uniform including all black shoes and plain black or white socks (the green CTS sports polo is a permitted item) We will provide uniform items to students to wear if necessary. More information will be provided to families about photos and the ordering process.



Progress reports will be published by the end of Week 7 and this will provide feedback to support our **Parents Student Teacher Conferences** Wednesday 27th March in Week 9. Families will be notified when reports are published and interview times are open to book on Compass. Finally, we finish the term on Thursday 28th March at 2:25pm which will be an **out of uniform day** ran by our SRC with some other fun activities planned, more information to be provided!

Senior Sub–School Report

It has been a busy start to the year as our senior students settle into either Year 11 or Year 12. We have had the school's swimming and athletics carnivals, meanwhile students (and teachers) have been trying to settle into their new classes. Students are recognising the time required to commit to their studies and determining how they will balance this with part-time work, sporting and social commitments.

Our Vocational Major students have been busy seeking and organising their work placements. These placements are an integral part of the Vocational Major program and provide students with an excellent introduction to working life. The experience they gain during their placement often has a direct impact on their future employment prospects. Students needed to complete two OH&S modules before entering the workplace.

Meanwhile, our students in the VCE stream recently participated in a workshop focused on improving study skills. Delivered by Deakin University, the workshop helped students to understand what approach to study will suit them and consider how they can get the most out of their final years of secondary school.

In the interest of further assisting our students to improve their work readiness, we have provided students with expression of interest applications regarding the Year 11 Work Experience camp to Melbourne. This camp provides a great opportunity for students to develop further understanding of the workforce and to gain confidence in navigating the Melbourne public transport.

The school planners are currently a tool we are using to support students to be independent and organised. Students are required to bring them to their morning mentor and each session throughout the day as well as their pencil case. There may be times students don't 'use' these tools but the practice of being responsible for their belongings and organised creates important habits.

As they enter the final years of school some of our students obtain their licence, it is important that all students who wish to drive to school do so within the terms of our school policies. Students who wish to drive to school should see Mr Beveridge or Mrs Cook to discuss our expectations.

My thanks to everyone for a great start to the year. Keep up the good work.

Junior Sub–School Report

Careers Report

The new year sees the start of another cycle again of preparing to support those students who will transition to education or employment, of providing opportunities for the exploration of career options and supporting students to gain valuable work experience. To that end we have been in discussions again with Deakin University to deliver a range of programs to our students in 2024. Our Year 11 and 12 VCE students have already participated in a very successful pathways and study skills workshop, delivered by Deakin University on site at Cobden Technical School. Students were engaged by the program and learnt a great deal about their individual study preferences and many tips for improving their study performance. We have negotiated, further, that Deakin University will provide our Year 12's with SEA's and VTAC application support in August, Year 10's will visit Deakin University in June for a University immersion day and Year 9's will participate in a program across three days that will help them prepare for the future by focusing on the development of employability skills and considering career pathways.

Discussions are also well underway with the Neil Porter Legacy to plan potential program delivery for the year. The Neil Porter Legacy has appointed a staff member two days a week who will be responsible for the delivery of support services in the Corangamite Shire. Initial discussions suggest that we will be able to continue to access many of the programs delivered by the Neil Porter Legacy over the last two years and that there is opportunity for the development of new programs tailored specifically to our needs. There will be a follow up meeting on the 13/3 to confirm program calendar for the year.

Morrisby testing dates have been negotiated and testing of our Year 9's has been set for the month of May. Morrisby have providing some online training videos that should help us in ensuring that the delivery of the testing and interviews runs smoothly. Students will be presented with an information session before detailed information packages that include consent forms go out to parents later this term.

Planning is well underway for the Year 11 work experience camp. Students have been given expression of interest forms and early indications suggest that we can look forward to enjoying a week in Melbourne with our Year 11 cohort exploring the world of work and familiarising ourselves with the Melbourne public transport system.

It is important that our senior students are given a lot of support at this time of year. To this end, we have been busily helping Year 11 and 12 VCE-VM students find and confirm their work placements for the year. Almost all students have settled well into starting their work placements. Approximately 75% of Year 11 and Year 12 students have completed Career Action Plans that will inform our pathway planning for each student as they move forward.

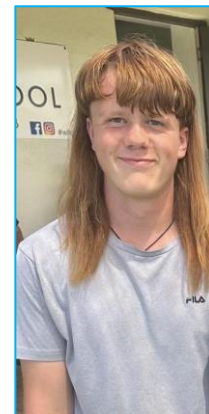
