Excitement Builds for Open Night – 18 March

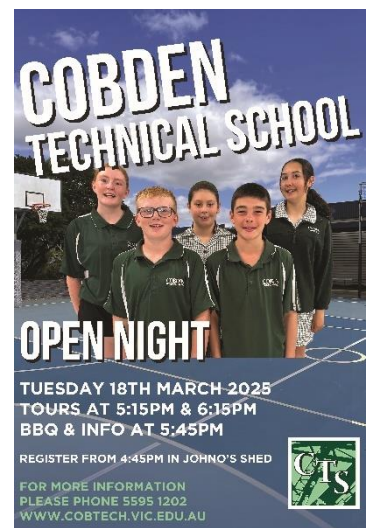

I cannot stress highly enough the importance of planning and consistent effort to ensure that students minimise their stress and maximise their results. Planning will ensure that students are able to utilise their time wisely, meet deadlines, and be prepared. Consistent effort will ensure that students are keeping on top of their work and not leaving assessment tasks to the last minute. Any students who are having difficulties meeting the requirements of their studies should see Mr Beveridge to discuss matters in which they can eliminate these difficulties.

Students are reminded that, if they wish to undertake a job trial or a **work placement**, it is necessary that you complete and return appropriate paperwork **BEFORE** you undertake your placement. Without completing this form it is actually illegal for students to attend the workplace when they should be at school. Furthermore, students will not be covered by the Department of Education Insurance if injured at work. If you wish to go out into the workforce, please see Mr Beveridge so he can approve your placement and provide you with the necessary paperwork to be completed.

Information will come out later next week regarding the **Year 11 Work Experience camp** to Melbourne and the **Year 10 Work Experience**. Students will be given hard copies of this information, and the documents will be uploaded to Compass. Please ensure that you discuss these programs with relevant students and allow us to start finalising plans for the rest of the year.

Congratulations to those senior students who attended the CTS Athletics. Those who attended set great examples for the younger students. On a warm, sunny day, our senior students participated in most events and maintained positive attitudes throughout the day, well done.



Students are reminded that being a senior student allows them a significant opportunity to mould the culture of our school. It is important that our students set a positive example at all time. Annual privacy reminder for our school community

Parent visitors to school

We ask that parents avoid arranging to visit their children at school wherever possible, as this can cause inappropriate disruptions to the school day. However, we understand that there may occasionally be a reason why a parent or carer may want to speak to or see their child at school, during school hours. We request that you please call the school administration office to arrange this and do not contact your child directly as students are not permitted to use their mobile devices during the school day.

All parents or carers who visit our school during school hours, other than for the purposes of scheduled school pick ups and drop offs or for specific school events (eg parent teacher interviews, concerts, assemblies etc) are required to check in as a visitor at the administration office and if they are signing out their child (eg. to attend an appointment during the day) they must do this in person at the administration office.
