Our **Year 9 NAPLAN results** have now been released, and the leadership team is reviewing the data to identify our strengths and areas for continued improvement. Staff will use this information alongside classroom assessment data to help plan teaching and learning. A special congratulations to the **five Year 9 students who achieved above expected growth from Year 7 to Year 9**. This is a fantastic achievement and something these students should be very proud of.

Work on our new building continues, and there will be another change to our school grounds during the upcoming holidays. Our current student toilets will be demolished, with **temporary toilet facilities installed for Term 4** while this stage of the project is completed.

We recently said goodbye to our **Indonesian exchange students** after a wonderful two weeks at Cobden Tech. Our visitors joined classes and experienced life with local host families, providing a fantastic cultural experience for everyone involved. Last week, we welcomed back the **Year 6 students enrolled at CTS for 2027** for another transition visit. Students participated in Humanities and Textiles, including making their own hacky sacks. It was lovely to have them back with us and see them becoming increasingly comfortable around the school. **Enrolments for 2027 are now open**, and we continue to welcome enquiries from families considering Cobden Tech at all year levels.

Cobden Technical School was proud to host the annual Science and Maths at Work expo for 2026. In celebration of National Science Week the Expo celebrates the role of Maths and Science in the workplace. The Expo, originally the brain child of our very own Andrea Stoddart has since become a project facilitated by the Neil Porter Legacy in conjunction with the host school, has become an exciting component of the careers education calendar. The event brings junior students from across the Corangamite region together to participate in workshops delivered by participants in a range of industries from across our region. Organisations that participated in 2026 were Acciona, Ambulance Victoria, Amplitude, Corangamite CMA, Corangamite Shire Council, Halter, Parks Victoria, Ridley's Agriproducts, RIST, Saputo, Southern Land Bovine Services, South West Academy of Sport, Victorian Police, Wannon Water, Westvic Dairies, and Warrnambool Hydraulics. The event was made possible through funding provided by the Demo Dairy Foundation and Beach Energy. Students from Camperdown College, Hampden P-12, Terang College, and Timboon P-12 joined Cobden Technical School students for the day, giving students the opportunity to mingle with others the same age from across the region. Presenters on the day used a range of activities to introduce students to the nature of the work that they do with an emphasis on highlighting the relevance of maths and science in their workplace. Students were seen to be engaged and interested throughout the day and learnt about the career opportunities in our region. Cobden Technical School students showed leadership and community spirit throughout the day, participating enthusiastically in the workshops and gladly supporting visitors to our school. I congratulate and thank them for their enormous contribution to the success of the day.



Whilst our Year 7 and 8 students were participating in the Maths & Science @ Work Expo, our Year 9 and 10 students celebrated Science week by attending Warrnambool Wildlife Encounters (formerly the Cudjee Wildlife Park). Students were informed of the role wildlife parks play in our conservation efforts, learnt detailed information about the animals contained within the park and were exposed to a variety of career opportunities that existed within such an industry. Students were blessed by a sunny day and enjoyed their day out and the opportunity to learn more about the world around them in a different environment.



Senior school students are quickly approaching the end of the year. Many of our Year 12 students have already seen me and together we have begun the process of making VTAC applications to apply for entry to tertiary study in 2027. All students are reminded that these applications need to be made by the end of September in order to avoid a late fee. Students are also reminded that they can change these applications after they have been entered so they do not need to feel that they are certain about their pathways for next year before they start the application. The important thing is to get started and to get entered into the system before the end of September. Students should see Mr Beveridge for assistance.

Year 10 students have nominated their preferred pathways for 2027 and any interest in participating in VET studies. Over the next few weeks our possible subject offerings for 2027 will be determined and students will be able to begin to make their selections for 2027. Students and parents are encouraged to meet with Mr Beveridge to discuss any elements of their pathway planning.

Alongside the hands-on volunteering, students will also take time to reflect on why supporting the wider community matters, considering the value of giving back and the positive impact volunteering can have both for the community and for themselves.

It's a fantastic example of PDS students putting their learning into practice, building strong community connections while developing a genuine sense of civic responsibility. Well done to all students involved for representing CTS so well out in the community!





It has been another action-packed and engaging period for students in the CTS Junior Sub-School, with a range of learning experiences providing opportunities to explore new skills, connect classroom learning to the real world and represent our school with pride.

A recent highlight was the Neil Porter Maths and Science Day, hosted here at CTS. Students participated in a diverse program of activities designed to bring together mathematical and scientific thinking through practical, hands-on challenges. The day encouraged students to see how integrated Maths and Science skills can be applied beyond the classroom, with a particular focus on career-based pathways and the many ways these skills are used in different industries and professions. It was fantastic to see students' problem-solving, collaborating and approaching challenges with curiosity and enthusiasm.

Our Year 9 and 10 students also recently enjoyed an excursion to Warrnambool Wildlife Encounters in Cudjee. Students had the opportunity to get hands-on with a variety of native animals while learning more about the wildlife found throughout our region of Victoria. Through a strong focus on conservation, animal rescue and rehabilitation, students gained a greater appreciation of the important work involved in protecting and caring for our native species. The day also included a visit to the Logans Beach Whale Nursery Lookout, where students did some whale spotting in the hope of seeing some early arrivals during the migration season. While the wildlife experiences were certainly memorable, the behaviour of our students was equally impressive. All students represented Cobden Technical School with respect, maturity and enthusiasm, and we are very proud of the way they approached the day.



We were also pleased to welcome our future Year 7 students for another transition experience. This time, students had the opportunity to explore some of the Technology learning areas and experience the practical and creative opportunities available at CTS. A special shout-out goes to our Textiles Department, which provided students with the opportunity to get involved in this highly creative, skilled and hands-on trade area.

Looking ahead, our Year 9 students are getting excited about their upcoming Melbourne Camp. The jam-packed experience will see students exploring the city and visiting locations including the Shrine of Remembrance, the MCG, Hosier Lane, ACMI, Federation Square, Melbourne Central, Queen Victoria Market, an indoor rock-climbing venue and the Eureka Skydeck. Along the way, students will also develop valuable independence and navigation skills as they learn how to travel around, over and under Melbourne's CBD successfully and grab bargain or to for their families at home.

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) is a commonly diagnosed neurodevelopmental condition that affects how children regulate attention, impulses and activity levels. While many children can appear restless, distracted or forgetful at times, ADHD involves ongoing patterns that may impact learning, behaviour, organisation and relationships. These challenges can sometimes lead to frustration at home and school, particularly when a child is trying hard but struggling to meet expectations.

For families, understanding ADHD means recognising that these behaviours are not simply a matter of effort or discipline. ADHD is influenced by a combination of neurological, biological and environmental factors that affect how a child's brain processes information and manages self-control. With the right support, structure and strategies, children with ADHD can develop the skills they need to succeed and thrive.

Last week, I had the privilege of attending the annual **Autism in Schools Conference** in Melbourne, hosted by the Autism Teaching Institute and Western Autistic School. The day brought together experts, educators and community representatives to share best practice in supporting autistic students. A highlight for me was the Friendship Symposium, where autistic teenagers shared their own experiences of education and what helps them feel understood, connected and supported.

The Victorian Government's Autism Education Strategy aims to improve learning and wellbeing outcomes for autistic students and build school communities where autistic students and their families feel welcomed and valued.

What does this mean for your child? At Cobden Technical School, the strategy strengthens our commitment to providing meaningful, personalised adjustments and creating classrooms where every student can thrive. Through Student Support Groups, Individual Education Plans, small-group programs and tailored activities, we work to understand each student's strengths and needs and help them feel connected and valued.

As a parent of autistic children myself, I understand how important it is to know that your child is known, supported and cared for at school. I encourage family partnership and open communication, always feel free to contact me to discuss your child's needs.
