Health and PE

In the Health and Physical Education subject area we are very proud of the student's participation rates and efforts. In 2020, we will continue to expect nothing less than full participation, in full uniform. Most importantly, working to improve our own performance with genuine effort and being respectful of others is the only way forward. Certainly, the early indications from classes is that this is going to be the case.

Excitingly, the new weights and spin room have been finalised. Senior classes have already used this space to benefit not only their health and wellbeing and understanding of the VCE content. In addition, we have realigned our focus areas for Year 7-10 Health and PE classes.

YEAR 7 – SPORTS FOR TEAMWORK
YEAR 8 – SPORTS FOR HEALTH AND WELLBEING
YEAR 9 – SPORTS PATHWAYS 1
YEAR 10 – SPORTS PATHWAYS 2



The Year 9 and 10 areas will expose students to future career pathways in the Sports and Health domain. Sports Coaching and Teaching, Sports Science and Biomechanics, Personal Training and there will be exposure to the VCE course to allow students to make considered choices regarding their pathways. Year 7s and 8s will be focusing on Swimming and Athletics Inter-House Sports preparation and Minor Games to develop their teamwork and health and wellbeing.

A reminder of some of the expectations for classes this year:

1. Correct CTS sports gear required for practical activities (unless specified otherwise) a CTS green shirt, black shorts and/or track pants, runners, plain white or black socks and CTS hats (Term1 and 4).
2. At the end of Session 6 only, students can remain in sports uniform if it is CTS sports uniform as listed above.
3. Only a parent note or phone call excuses non-participation in practical activities. No note, no participation = 1 demerit point. Repeated non-participation will be a phone call home and further consequences.
4. No aerosol cans to be used full stop. This is a nasty trigger for asthmatics.
5. Our CORE VALUES are expected and apply here.
 - a. HONESTY – be true to yourself and give honest effort. Tell the truth.
 - b. EXCELLENCE (EFFORT) – expect high standards of yourself and others. Strive for improvement.
 - c. ACCOUNTABILITY – accept responsibility for your actions.
 - d. RESPECT – equipment, each other and yourself.
 - e. TRUST – do the right thing when no-one's watching.

VCE ASSESSMENT SATISFACTORY COMPLETION

For satisfactory completion of a unit, a student must demonstrate achievement of the set of outcomes for that unit as

specified in the VCAA Unit Study Design. The decision about the satisfactory completion of an outcome is based on the teacher's professional judgement of the students' performance on set work and assessment tasks designated for the unit.

The assessment of levels of achievement is separate from the decision to award an S for satisfactory completion of a unit. VCE unit results (S or N) contribute to satisfactory completion of the certificate and not to study score calculation.

To achieve this outcome means:

- a) the work meets the required standard.
- b) the work is clearly the student's own.

Where the assessment item developed combines the demonstration of outcomes (S or N) and levels of achievement (scored assessment), best practice would support students who did not meet the outcome through the completion of the assessment item being afforded additional opportunities to demonstrate the outcome. For example, a teacher may consider work previously submitted, provided it meets the requirements. Students may not resubmit work to improve a School-based Assessment score. NOTE : an N for 'one' outcome means an N for the whole Unit.

Not satisfactory VCE unit result The student will receive an N (not satisfactory) for the unit when one or more of the following occurs:

- the work does not demonstrate achievement of the outcomes
- the student has failed to meet a school deadline for the assessment task, including if an extension of time has been granted for any reason, including Special Provision
- the work cannot be authenticated, for example through lack of attendance
- there has been a substantial breach of rules.

Redeeming outcomes – submitting further evidence for satisfactory completion. If, in the judgment of the teacher, work submitted by a student does not meet the required standard for satisfactory completion, the teacher may consider other work relating to outcomes undertaken and submitted by the student for the unit. This work may include class work, homework, additional tasks or discussions with the student that demonstrate their understanding of the outcome.

The school may decide to delay the decision about satisfactory completion to allow a student to complete or submit further work. A student may only submit further evidence, or resubmit a School-based Assessment for reconsideration, to redeem an S for the outcome. Students may not resubmit to improve a School-based Assessment score.

Lost, stolen or damaged work – If a teacher or student has lost work or had work stolen or damaged, they must make a written statement explaining the circumstances. The statement must be signed, dated and filed at the school. Schools must keep a record of the loss or damage, but should not report it to the VCAA. The principal, acting on advice from the teacher, and on the basis of records kept, shall determine the unit result for the student.

Care in the use of technology – A student who uses technology to produce work for assessment is responsible for ensuring that:

- there is an alternative system available for producing assessable work in case of malfunction or unavailability
- hard copies of the work in progress and back-up versions are produced regularly.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

Deakin University - In Conversation Yr 11 & 12 Students

Our Year 11 & 12 students travelled to Deakin University last month to participate in a program delivered by current university and TAFE students. They presented a three-part workshop looking at study habit myths, provided tools for managing stress and explored alternative career pathways. Each workshop included the exploration and discussion of key topics. The open Q&A session was particularly valuable as our students were able to ask questions to find out what the students thought about course choices, campus life and managing part time work with study.

Profiling March 26th

Interviews April 27th -29th

The Department of Education and Training is supporting all secondary schools to provide comprehensive career education from Year 7. This includes a new, free, career advisory service for Year 9 students.

The service is designed to help students make better choices about subject selection, vocational education and training, senior secondary school certificates and further study. CTS will have access to:

- an online personal career discovery tool that identifies potential suitable careers in a report
- analysis of their career assessment report by an accredited career practitioner
- follow-up one-on-one career counselling to progress their choice to reality. The service uses a personal online career discovery tool (Morrisby Online) which provides objective and relevant information about the student and the opportunities available.

Once the assessment has been completed the student will be provided with a report and a 1:1 career counselling session. This will be conducted by a qualified career practitioner during school hours at school, with parents encouraged to attend. Discussions will include short-term specific subject choices as well as training, higher education and employment pathways and will inform the career action plan the student completes at school. The student is provided with a 'Log in for life' to the career discovery tool. Students are able to revisit the tool across the remainder of their school life (and beyond) to complete additional assessments and undertake research in new areas of interest.

Western District Tertiary Information Service Event Thursday, 23rd April, 9.30am-10.45am

The TIS is a collective of universities, TAFE institutions and independent Tertiary Colleges who prepare students for their future careers by providing free events around Victoria. CTS Year 11 & 12 VCE students will attend an information session in Camperdown on Thursday 23th of April, 9.30 am – 10.45am. This TIS session will involve a panel of tertiary representatives addressing issues relating to tertiary study with an opportunity for students to ask questions. Following the presentation, students will be able to speak with representatives of individual institutions and collect relevant information.

Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden

Media Release

As the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program for the Secondary Years expands its reach in Victoria, a new survey of Aussie teens exposes the need for more food education to improve poor eating habits that put a healthy adulthood at risk.

- Close to a third (29%) of Aussie teens admit to eating food from fast food chains at least once a week and more than a fifth indulge in hot chips (23%) every week.
- More than half (51%) don't know how many serves of fruit and vegetables they should be eating a day however, 99% consider learning to cook as important.
- Nearly a quarter (24.9%) of all Australian children and adolescents aged 5-17 years are either overweight or obese. This figure increases as students graduate with 46% of those aged 18-24 years in Australia overweight or obese



MELBOURNE, 2 FEBRUARY 2020: A new raft of students in Victoria will start the year taking part in a one-of-a-kind program, as pleasurable food education expands to more secondary school students. The Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Foundation has today announced the expansion of the Kitchen Garden Program for the Secondary Years into eight additional secondary schools in the state from this year. The three-year pilot project was developed in direct response to demand from teachers, parents and students themselves, who saw the need for pleasurable food education to extend beyond primary school.



Stephanie Alexander AO, Founder of the Kitchen Garden Foundation, believes “When you know how to cook, you know that good food doesn't have to be time-consuming or costly and is the opposite of a chore. Learning to know and love fresh, seasonal, delicious food is as basic as understanding where food comes from and learning a few simple cooking skills. This gives young people a lot of confidence. “Our program is designed to get students' hands dirty and experience the thrill of growing their own fruit, vegetables and herbs. Then turning their harvest into delicious meals to share with their classmates. There's nothing like it to create a sense of pride and achievement.”
